

ERRATUM in: Graphical Models of Marks of Groups by S. Fujita and S. El-Basil

In the course of preparing volume **46** of MATCH for the printing process, the last but one version of the paper mentioned in the headline was unfortunately mixed up with the final version. The Managing Editor of this issue apologizes for this mistake. The difference between these two versions was in the first paragraph of section 1 which was corrected by cancelling the last sentence that contained a misunderstanding concerning Redfield's acquaintance with Burnside's results on tables of marks. (It is not clear if Redfield possessed Burnside's book and which edition, if yes. Moreover, it would be important, for historical reasons, to obtain an answer for this question.) The paragraph in question should read as follows:

1. Historical Background and Definitions

... Historically, Burnside (1911) published some mark tables for a few groups in the 2nd edition of his famous book [6] but attracted only little attention. Redfield thought he had (re)discovered these tables in 1937, as found in his article published far after his death [7].
